AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM BONDS OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN PINES, NORTH CAROLINA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN PINES, NORTH CAROLINA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Bonds of the Town be issued to the aggregate principal amount of TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) for the purpose of constructing a Water Supply System.

Section 2. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. A statement of the debt of the Town has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town at an election as provided in the said Act.

The foregoing Ordinance was passed on the 15th day of July, 1936, and was first published on the 31st day of July, 1936.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said Ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
