## What and Why

lief?

The experience of the Resettlement Administration tends strongly to prove that loans to destitute and low income farm families are a much less expensive form of relief than dierct grants. , The average cost of grants per family over an eight month period is about \$150. This is the amount it takes to furnish a famerage loan is about \$350. Of this seventy percent is expected to be repaid. Thus the net loss per family under the loan program is approximately percent more under direct relief.

The family gets not only money for subsistence but also for the purequipment, and a farm and home plan which will enable the family to use its
