Historic Johnson Grove Church Sold Under Auctioneer's Hammer in Carthage, Moore County, and pre-

Erected Nearly 50 Years Ago to Serve Needs of Growing Vass Community

"Two hundred and fifty-five, once, two hundred and fifty-five twice, two hundred and fifty-five three times, and sold to W. J. Allen," intoned W. E. Gladstone as a sizeable group of men and women stood around old Johnson's Grove Church last Satur_ day afternoon, some there as prospective buyers, others as folks whose hearts were just so sort of linked up with the old building that they had to be near it in its last great hour.

Johnson's Grove Church was erected nearly 50 years ago to meet the needs of the growing Vass community, there being no church in easy walking distance and only two "bugby horses" around.
