Thomas C. Arstor of Atlanta, Ga., was a local visitor on Monday.

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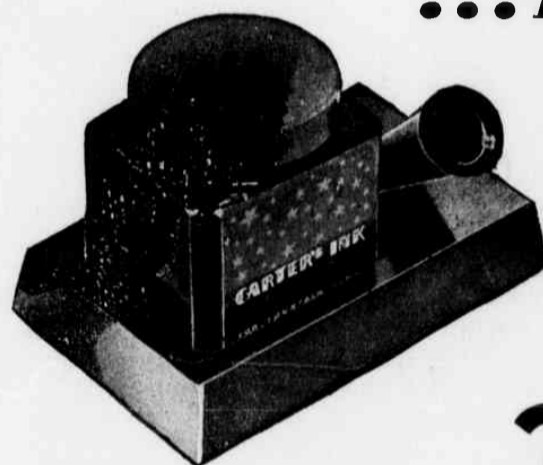
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
