STILL TIME TO ENLIST IN SOIL CONSERVING PROGRAM

Notice has been received that those who are short on Soil Conserving acreage may still meet this requirement by putting in Vetch or Austrian Winter Peas. "This", says County Agent E. H. Garrison, Jr., "should give almost everyone, who wanted to comply a chance to still cooperate with the program. The first notice was to the effect that we had until October 1st to get these crops in, but the time has been extended to October 31st."

"So far there have been very few who have not complied and this new ruling should give a great many others a chance now to come in on the program. From the looks of the fields now I would say that there are three or four times as many beans and peas put in this year as have ever been planted before. The results of this should show up well in next year's crop and be an inducement for a great many people to continue with a program of sowing, such as we have had this year. Where peas or other crops are turned this year it will be necessary that we be notified of this and the acreage checked so that you will get credit for all this work. Notices were sent to all producers some time ago, to this effect."

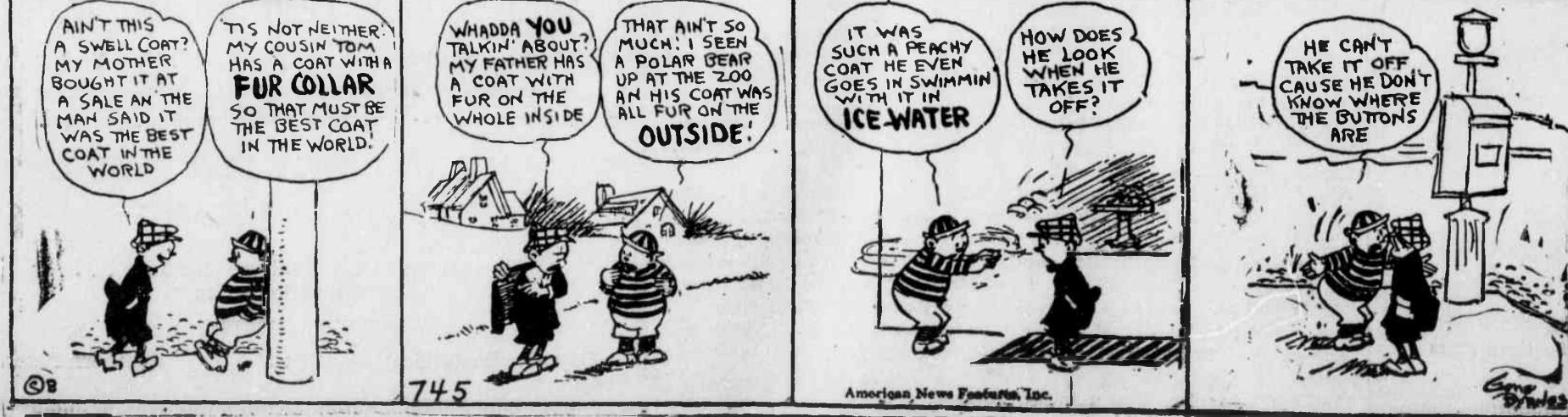
