

16 MOORE COUNTY GIRLS AT U. N. C. WOMAN'S COLLEGE

Sixteen of the 1,790 students enrolled at the Woman's College of the University of North Carolina for the fall semester are from Moore county. Of the 100 counties of the state, 97 have representatives in the student body, which is the largest in recent years. Last year's registration

was 1,563, and the figure for the previous year was 1,382. Dr. W. C. Jackson is dean of administration of the Woman's College.
