Mr. Hawfield deplored the fact that some teachers were unfair to pupils in insisting all things in their textbooks were important. His favorite teaching philosophy is "A better social order." Mr. Hawfield's address provided an oasis of thought for the progressive teachers assembled on the gala plains of this festive occasion.
