S. G. Hawfield of Cabarrus county, who made a highly entertaining and instructive lecture on the merits of the Unit Plan of teaching. Mr. Hawfield deplored the fact that some teachers were unfair to pupils in insisting all things in their textbooks were important. His favorite teaching philosophy is "A better social order." He claimed that the unit plan has been effective in putting over this philosophy in Cabarrus county for the past decade. After relating a few interesting classroom incidents illustrating the virtues of the plan, Supt. Hawfield explained that a good unit of work should: 1—be on the child's level; 2—provide for numerous and varied activities that are real; 3—be rich in cultural background; 4—provide training in basic skills; 5—find possibilities and capacities of individual pupils and groups of pupils; 6—provide for trips and new experiences; 7—involve the use of various materials and references. Mr. Hawfield's address provided an oasis of thought for the progressive teachers assembled on the gala plains of this festive occasion.
