The Seaboard has long been recognized for its pioneering efforts. and under the leadership of Mr. Powell has been most active in promoting travel to and from the to introduce air-conditioned equipment on its trains. The placing of service, however, is the most fcr. ward step so far made by the Railroad. Only two others of the same great horsepower have been constructed; they are in use on transcontinental lines in the West.

The new Seaboard locomotives are also the longest type in the world. each unit of three locomotives being 210 feet in length. Commenting on this first large-scale introduction of Diesel power in the Southeast by the Seaboard, Mr. Powell said in part: "Diesels are the newest marvels in railroad service, but that is of less importance to the public than the fact that these Seaboard locomotives are designed to provide the fastest-possible long distance transportation at the lowest-possible maximum speeds and with the utmost of comfort, safety and dependability under all operating conditions."

Construction of the Diesels is advancing rapidly at the plant of the Electro-Motive Corporation, La Grange, Illinois.

For Blackfire Leafspot diseases, aided by exdestructive in many tobacco fields throughout the State, according to

The most prominent and destructive of these diseases is blackfire. leaves, beginning as small yellowish specks which enlarge rapidly to onefourth to one-half inch in width. The attack causes the tissues to turn brown and die.

Blackfire is always most prevalent and destructive during periods of excessive rains. This results from two factors, First, blowing rain apparently is necessary for the rapid and South, being the first Southern road abundant spread of the bacterial parasite which causes the disease; and second, tobacco plants are more susthese huge Diesel locomotives into ceptible to attack by the parasite during conditions of high moisture,

No Known Control

Dr. Shaw pointed out that there is no known control for the disease once it has appeared in the field. However, he said, it has been observed that plants growing under conditions of high nitrogen are more susceptible than those growing under conditions of low nitrogen.


Such practices as growing plants in new sites, using new or sterilized old covers, and seed treatment will tend to reduce infection of plants in th bed. This, in turn, will reduce the amount of infection in the field. However, the State College pathologist said, it is evident that careful application of these practices will not guarantee control in the field.



for flue-cured (cigarette type tobacco) rather favorable," the bureau said, "but tobacco actually purchased in any given season generally does not reach the hands of consumers until one or three years later."

"The demand of domestic manufacturers for cigarette tobacco in the present season as compared with the preceding probably will be related significantly to the level and the trend of general business activity and wholesale prices as well as to cigarette withdrawals as such.

"Recent upturns in commodity prices and business activity, if continued, will tend to expand domestic demand for the current flue-cured crop.

"Unless the improvement in commodity prices and general domestic conditions, however, is considerably more rapid than is expected, the market situation will be somewhat less favorable than in 1937."
