## 200 FAMILIES HERE AIDED BY FARM SECURITY FUND

The Farm Security Administration, an agency of the Department of Agriculture which was made possible by the Federal Government to assist low-income farmers in planning their farming operations, has been in operation since 1937, during this time it has served more than 200 farm families in Moore county.

During the past year there was \$1,827.00 dollars loaned to some 78 families in the county—approximately \$234.00 per family. Fifteen cows, 46 pigs, and eleven mules, besides the money to purchase many tons of fertilizer, foods and clothing were bought so that the cash price could be taken advantage of.

An F. S. A. loan is a planned supervised loan. A systematic and well balanced farm and home plan is developed to determine the needs of the particular family. From the home side the actual needs of the family to provide a well balanced diet, good health, adequate clothing and other operative expenditures in the home are determined and provisions made to attain these standards.
