

**Miss McCaskill Named
NYA District Supervisor**

**Her Appointment Announced by
Lang Upon Resignation of
I. N. Clegg, Jr.**

John A. Lang, State NYA Administrator, announced this week that I. N. Clegg, Jr., of Carthage, has tendered his resignation as NYA Supervisor of Moore and Montgomery counties. Mr. Clegg stated that the increasing demands of his insurance agency in Carthage made it necessary for him to devote his full time to business affairs.

In accepting the resignation, Mr. Lang commended Mr. Clegg upon the splendid work he has performed and stated: "The projects which have been undertaken in Moore and Montgomery counties during your regime are indeed a credit to the NYA and to the people in our section of the state. It is with a great deal of regret, therefore, that I accept your resignation. I am wishing for you, however, every

possible success in your business affairs."

Effective September 16, Mr. Lang has appointed Miss Myrtle McCaskill of Carthage as NYA Supervisor of Moore and Montgomery counties.
