## Theatre

Myrna Loy, teamed for the first time with Melvyn Douglas, abandons her role as the "perfect wife" to keep the man who made Garbo laugh in continuous hot water in "Third Finger, Left Hand," hilarious story of a romantic mix-up coming to the Pinehurst Theatre Sunday night October 20th at 8:30 and to Southern Pines Monday and Tuesday October 21, 22, with a Tuesday matinee. Seen as a New York career woman, the editor of a fashion magazine, is Myrna Loy who has adopted the stratagem of pretending to be married in order to hold her job and not be pestered by a bevy of suitors. Her eventual undoing comes through a chance meeting with a young artist portrayed by Melvyn Douglas, an artist very sure of himself and his ideas, as well as of the pleasure to be gained by living in his small home town in Ohio.

Story, direction and cast are here blended into a comedy which maintains a smooth pace and is at the same time punctuated by individual sequences which evoked hearty and spontaneous preview night applause. George Abbott has taken his highly successful musical comedy, "Too Many Girls," the big Broadway stage success, and, making his debut as a film producer and director, transferred it to the screen with such fidelity and expense as to classify it as one of the top musicals of its kind, which is the attraction at Southern Pines Wednesday and Thursday October 23, 24 at 8:15. From his Broadway cast, Abbott obtained Desi Arnaz, Cuban congo dancer; Hal LeRoy, eccentric dancer; Edith Bracken and Libby Bennett. He added Ann Miller, Lucille Ball, Richard Carlson, Francis Langford, Harry Shannon and many others. Interspersed throughout the story are ten musical numbers, the finale being one of the most outstanding seen on the screen in a long time.

Each new Deanna Durbin film is anticipated with keen interest, and her latest one, "Spring Parade," the attraction at Southern Pines Friday and Saturday, October 25, 26, with a Saturday matinee, will not disappoint. On the contrary, it is as sprightly and gay as any in which she has ever appeared, and some will declare it her best, and that's saying a great deal. Be that as it may, "Spring Parade" with its nostalgic setting of old entertainment to soothe both the eye and ear. ### ROOM FOR 5000 WORKERS AT FORT BRAGG SOUGHT

the north and going clockwise, the circle runs up within a mile or so of Chapel Hill and then include Raleigh, Clayton, Selma, Newton Grove, Faison, Turkey, Tomahawk, Clerkin, Boardman, Oils and McCall, S. C., Hamlet, Rockingham, Biscoe, Why-not, Siler City and back to near Chapel Hill.

Anyone living closer to Fort Bragg than these points is within the 50-mile radius. Some of the other towns included are Dunn, Lumberton, St. Pauls, Clinton, Sanford, Carthage, Aberdeen, Laurinburg, Fuquay Springs, Holly Springs, Bladenboro, Elizabethtown, Newton Grove, Ellington, Southern Pines and Rowland.

Unless these towns can absorb 5,000 workers, the construction of barracks at Fort Bragg will not come off on schedule. More than 1,000 buildings, whole blocks at a time, are to be finished by January 6.

The heavy influx of troops is due in mid-December. Even now, with the main floor yet to come, 8,000 men are reported living under canvas. To take time off to build temporary quarters for construction labor would mean a delay of two weeks and cost an estimated \$150,000, it was said.
