Session Will Be Conducted at Brownson Memorial Church on Tuesday, January 13.

The Presbytery of Fayetteville will hold its mid-winter meeting in Southern Pines at the Brownson Memorial Presbyterian Church on Tuesday, January 13, with the session opening at 10 a. m.

Election of a moderator and temporary clerk will be followed by the Presbyterial sermon, to be delivered by the Rev. W. L. Foley of Lillington, at the request of Olin L. Johnson, retiring moderator. This will be followed by the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Other matters of importance will be the report of the executive committees as follows: home missions, the Rev. E. L. Barber, local pastor; stewardship the Rev. F. M. Bain of Fayetteville, evangelism, the Rev. M. P. Calhoun of St. Pauls, the commission of the minister and his work, the Rev. W. S. Golden of Carthage, Edwin Morgan of Laurel Hill will report on Flora Macdonald College development program.

The Fayetteville Presbytery comprises the counties of Moore, Hoke, Scotland, Robeson, Cumberland, Harnett and half of Johnson, and includes 94 churches with a membership of 12,770 and 50 ministers. Each church is to be represented by the minister and one elder.

The session will continue throughout the day and lunch will be served by the ladies of the Women's Auxiliary, headed by Mrs. Ernest Bailey, in the Fellowship Hall of the Church.
