(In Raleigh, for instance, a 50 percent extra charge is made for those outside corporate limits).

Young Patch Gets Appointment As Flying Cadet In Air Corps

(Special to The Pilot) Craig Field, Alabama - Private Charles S. Patch, Jr., of Southern Pines, N. C., has been accepted as an Aviation Cadet for pilot training in the U. S. Army Air Corps. It was announced by the public relations office of Craig Field this week. Being only 19 years old, Patch has the distinction of being the youngest man to be accepted as a Flying cadet in this field. Pvt. Patch is the son of Mr. and Mrs. C. S. Patch of Southern Pines. He graduated from Southern Pines High School in 1940 and attended the University of North Carolina the fall

of that year. He enlisted in the Air Corps at Fort Bragg in the summer of 1941 and was immediately assigned to duty at Craig Field. While being stationed here, he served as an instructor in the Link Trainger department, and at the present is receiving flight training to be a Sergeant Pilot from which he will automatically be transferred to the Cadets on completion of his present training at Craig Field. At the completion of his pilot training, Patch will receive his pilot "wings" and be commissioned a second lieutenant in the U. S. Air Corps Reserves.
