Sugar Rationing

Rationing Books and Instructions Received; Date for Getting Stamps Not Set

Rationing books and instructions for the distribution of sugar, under wartime regulations, have been received by the Moore County Rationing Board, but the date for registration to receive these books has not yet been set, it was announced this week by J. L. McGraw, rationing chairman.

The rationing books which may be used later for other goods are to be distributed probably sometime near the first of April for the purchase of sugar by individuals and families. Complete instructions on their use will accompany them. Mr. McGraw said that the final registration plans for obtaining the rationing stamps would be announced later.

More Books Wanted For Use by Soldiers

F. L. Walton, U. S. O. program director at Fort Bragg, announced here yesterday that the U. S. O. is holding open house next Sunday at Fort Bragg, and that the organization is making a final drive to collect all books possible for use by the soldiers at the Fort.

The Red Cross room in the Straka building is serving as the depository for books which are to be given to the Army. Mr. Walton said that all books left there Friday, between 10 a. m. and 12 and 2 p. m. and 5 would be picked up Saturday and taken to the Fort.

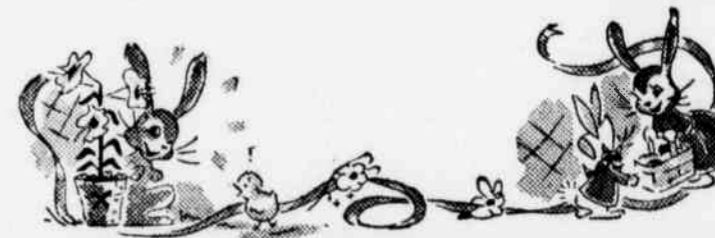

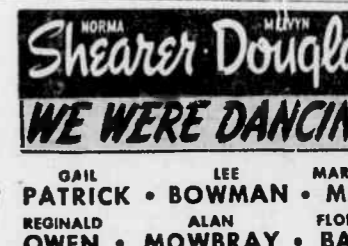

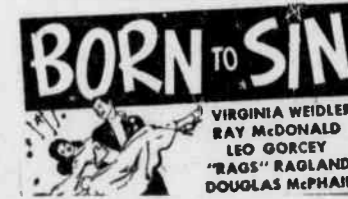
