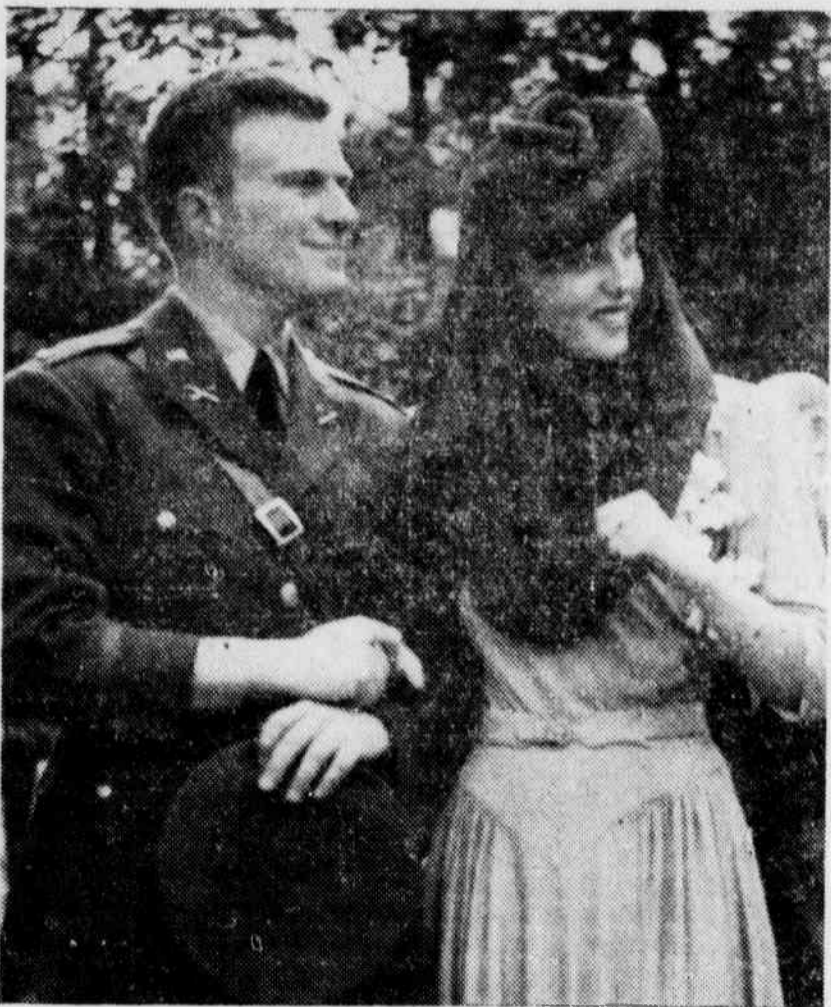


Lieut. and Mrs. Kenneth B. Schley, Jr.
