

BOY SCOUTS SEEK FUNDS FOR WORK

N. L. Hodgkins Appeals for Help to Young Americans Contributing to Effort

N. L. Hodgkins, Chairman of the Southern Pines Boy Scout Committee has announced that a drive is being undertaken to raise funds to continue the local Boy Scout work. This is a resumption of the drive held each year at this time.
