Mr. and Mrs. Meredith Herndon and children of Sanford visited with Mr. and Mrs. Robert Henderson Sunday.

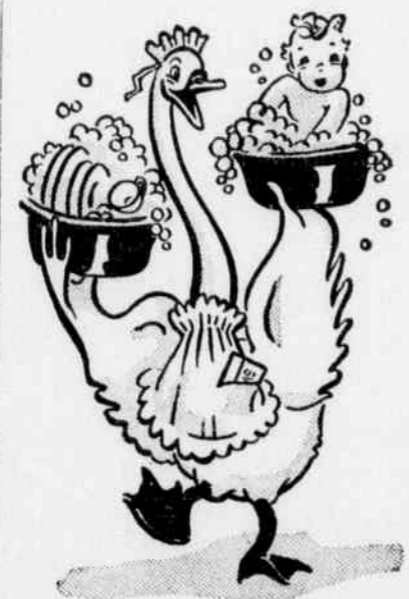

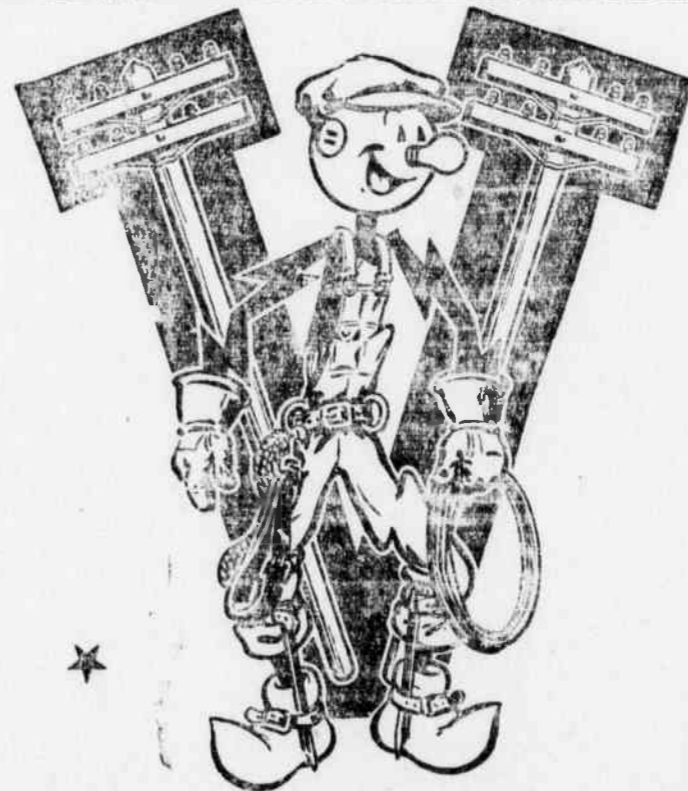
