War Ration Book 3 **To Be Applied For** By Mail, Says OPA

Information Posts Will Be Established To Help in Filling Out Blanks

Holders of War Ration Books Nos. 1 and 2 will not have to trek back to the schoolhouse to procure No. 3, but will make application for and receive their books by mail, and information posts will be set up throughout the county for the benefit of those who are unable to fill out their cards unaided. In Southern Pines help will be available at the Town Hall from 9:00 to 12:00 noon, and from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. each week day from May 29 to June 10 and in West Southern Pines at the

"By reading carefully the instructions on the simple application, you will have no troubles," says Mrs. Maurice, adding: "Only one application shall be filled out for any one family, with all names of the family group on one application. No members of the Armed Forces may apply for Book 3 at this time. Their names are not to be placed on applications. All information must be printed, except the signature, which must be written."


