The auditorium floor, where a maze of wiring connects with the large room above, the flames were most intense.

Nearly two hours of exhausting, blistering work were required before the last of the flames was extinguished. A number of joists were burned out from beneath the upper end of the auditorium, and a large hole eaten into the floor itself. Through this aperture sparks were flying into the auditorium, but ladder crews quickly opened a space overhead and cut short further damage there.

After a thorough inspection of the building following the fire, Chief O'Callaghan mentioned the wiring following the floor and into the auditorium projection room as the probable source of the conflagration. Considered together with the potential seriousness of the fire, the sum of actual damage was small.
