Issuance of \$30,000 in bonds for the building of an incinerator was approved by 47 votes against 9.

No citizen who failed to go to the polls can plead not having registered; no special registration was required. Of the 500 names upon the books, dating from about 1920, approximately 400 are those of people still residing in Southern Pines. Votes were cast by 56 of these people, with a remainder of 344 who apparently did not care enough for the public welfare to voice their
