Burwell At Rotary Speaks of Plans For Air Park Here

Park Would Offer Owners of Small Planes Ideal Field

Swimming Pool, And Club Restaurant Part Of Development Plan

The president of Resort Airlines, Lewis C. Burwell, was the guest speaker at the regular luncheon meeting of the Southern Pines Rotary Club, held last Friday at the Lakeview Hotel.

In his talk to the Rotarians Burwell outlined what Resort Airlines had accomplised to date, what their present expansion program is, plus what they have in mind for the future.

Especially stressed by president Burwell was the opportunity he sees for the Sandhills in the development of the Knollwood Field into an Air Park, which would then be renamed Resort Air Park.

Burwell pointed out that there is no section in the State, or in the mid-South of the East, that offers as much to the rapidly increasing numbers of small plane owners as the vacation facilities in Southern Pines and Pinehurst.

While Resort Airlines wants and expects no aid from the County in the upkeep of Knollwood Field as far as their operations usage goes, it is felt that the County should take over the development of the Air Park for the influx of desirable air visitors. This development would include the construction of a swimming pool, of landscaping the grounds, and of renovating one of the pres (Continued on Page 10)


