### Judge Rowe Faces Full Docket In Recorder's Court

Marriage saved the day—or a court sentence anyway—when, at recorder's court Monday, it turned out that two Negro defendants in bedding - and - cohabitation cases had married each other and promised to live together, consequently prayer for judgment was continued on payment of court costs.

Defendants were Edward Lee Cooley, of Fayetteville and Ernestine Ferguson, of Southern Pines. Cooley additionally promised to support his wife and her child.

Similarly charged, Robert Brown and Ruth Ferguson, of this community, were given six months' sentences, suspended on payment of \$25 and costs, with conditions of good behavior in effect for the next two years.

Judge Rowe faced a full docket Monday, with 27 cases slated to be heard, including practically every kind of misdemeanor known to man—or woman. Judgments handed down, in addition to the above named, were as follows:

**Assault With Oil Can**  
Giles Seawell, Carthage, assault with deadly weapon (knife and oil can), 12 months suspended, \$100 and costs, on conditions of good behavior for two years and payment of the doctor's bill for the prosecuting witness; Arthur Seawell, Carthage, secret assault, nisi sifacias and instant capias (meaning he didn't show up and the law is hunting him, with orders to arrest on sight); L. C. Hall, Southern Pines, careless and reckless driving, driving while drunk, 60 days suspended, \$50 and costs, driver's license revoked for 12 months, payment of \$15.50 to be made for repairs to prosecuting witness' car; Wesley Monroe, Eastwood, careless and reckless driving, 30 days suspended, \$25 and costs.

**License Revoked**  
Bonnie Lee Cagle, West End, careless and reckless driving, driving while drunk, 60 days suspended, \$50 and costs, license revoked for 12 months; Calvin Lambert, Robbins, unlawful possession of non-taxpaid whiskey, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs; J. D. Sanders, Robbins, careless and reckless driving, speeding, driving without license, 60 days suspended, \$25 and costs, not to operate a motor vehicle on the streets or public roads of North Carolina until a license is obtained; Garland Williams, Robbins, assault with deadly weapon, cursing, 90 days suspended, \$35 and costs, \$5 to be paid the doctor who treated Astor Brown, the prosecuting witness.

**More Auto Cases**  
Cleo Garner, Lakeview, driving while drunk, 60 days suspended, \$50 and costs, license revoked for 12 months; Major Clark, Negro, Newport News, Va., careless and reckless driving, colliding with another car causing damage, driving without license, six months suspended, \$25 and costs, \$225 to be paid Daniel Vick for damage to his car, and not to operate a motor vehicle on the North Carolina highways until a license is obtained.

**Several Continued**  
Jack T. Boele, Southern Pines, speeding, 60 days suspended, \$25 and costs; Virginia Hill, Negro, Southern Pines, violation of health laws, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs, defendant to go at once to the treatment center at Durham to take required treatment as ordered by the North Carolina health department; Cephus Thompson, Aberdeen, assault, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs of \$22, at request of prosecuting witness; Handy Matthews, Negro, failure to comply with previous order of the court, capias returnable Monday; Tom Jackson, case set for trial June 30; Mitchell Russell, Negro, Pinehurst, assault, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs.

Clinton Williams, charged with assault and non-support, public drunkenness and assault on a female, demanded a jury trial and was bound over to superior court, under bond of \$100 for each charge.  
Roy Cameron, of the county home at Carthage, charged with public drunkenness, was given a 30-day road sentence, suspended on condition that he remain within the county home for the next 60 days, not leaving unless accompanied by an official of the institution.

**Called and Failed**  
Instant capias was issued for Vernon Short, alias Vernon Black, charged with driving after revocation of license, called and failed.

Also "called and failed" was Guy Clinton McNeill, charged with driving while drunk. His bond of \$100 was declared forfeit.

### Polio Chapter Meeting Is Held, Reports Given

Directors of the Moore County Polio chapter held a meeting at the Nurses' home at Pinehurst on Monday night of this week at which time H. Clifton Blue, chairman of the 1947 March of Dimes campaign for Moore county, gave a report of the funds collected, stating that a total of \$6,077.24 was raised during the 1947 drive as compared with \$6,325.03 during the 1946 campaign.

**Half Stays Here**  
Deduction of \$202.75 for campaign expenses leaves a net of \$5,874.49 to be divided, half to be sent to the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, the other half to be retained for use within Moore county.

N. L. Hodgkins, chapter treasurer, gave a report of the chapter's financial condition, saying that during the past year the chapter spent approximately \$2,903.97 in carrying on the fight against infantile paralysis in Moore county, in assisting victims of polio by paying for their hospital expenses, etc. He stated that the chapter had on hand approximately \$9,400.00 as of June 1.

A report of the meeting held in Goldsboro to map plans to fight infantile paralysis was given by Dr. J. W. Wilcox, Mrs. A. H. Poe and Mrs. Edith McLeod.

**One Case This Year**  
One case of polio was reported in Moore county in 1947, when Herbert McLaughlin, seven-year old colored boy of the Eastwood community was stricken. He was admitted to the hospital April 27.

Reports from the other patients receiving assistance from the chapter were made.
