

Drinking Drivers Feel Weight Of New State Law

Since the new traffic laws went into effect July 1, four first of-fenders in Moore county have felt the convincing argument of a \$100 fine imposed as a condition of a suspended sentence, the latest of them Lacie H. Maness, of Robbins, whose case was heard in recorder's court Wednesday.

To Herman Webster Deaton, of Sanford, went the dubious honor this fine imposed in the Moore county court. On July 14, there were James Tarlton Monroe, of Pinehurst, and Mack Pickler, of Ashley Heights.

Also, to each of them feeling the weight of the new law comes the knowledge that a second offinse means a \$200 fine, and a third, one of \$500.

Floyd P. Maness, fo Robbins, tried last Monday, just missed the deadline, and was fined \$50, plus costs, as it was shown that the offenses with which he was charged - driving while drunk, careless and reckless driving and improper brakes - occurred June 28, just before the new laws went into effect. He and Lacie Maness were also charged with costs and their drivers' licenses were revoked for 12 months. Their suspended sentences were for 60 days on the roads. Other judgments handded down


