Turned over to the city police, the driver, Solomon Gillis, Negro, of below Aberdeen, was charged with drunken driving, careless and reckless driving and leaving the scene of an accident.

### Troop Chartered At Scout Service

Southern Pines Troop 224, Boy Scouts of America, was formally chartered at a special service held Sunday evening at the First Baptist church, by whom it is sponsored.

The service, for all Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts, also marked the local observance of National Boy Scout Week.

The charter, presented by L. W. Hewett, field executive, was received by B. C. Nolan, scoutmaster, in behalf of the church and the troop. Archie Ferguson, assistant scoutmaster also took part.

Bobby Craft gave a history of the Boy Scout movement, for the benefit of assembled friends and parents, and the following boys took part in a responsive reading: Joe Smith, Charles Merrill, Billy Horner, Joe Horner, David Woodruff, Joseph Womble and Adrian Ferguson.

Each boy in turn read a point of the scout law, with its meaning in Boy Scout terms. The pastor, Rev. J. Lamar Jackson, made response with an illustrative passage from Scripture.

Representatives of Scout Troop 73 and of the Southern Pines Cub Scout pack were present.

### DETECTIVE

Deryl Holliday, 10, is a pretty good detective, in the opinion of Police Chief Newton, who said he did a neat job Saturday of bringing wrongdoers to justice—and incidentally, of getting his stolen bicycle back.

When Deryl saw a boy riding a bike he was pretty sure was his own, stolen January 25, he stopped the lad and engaged him in conversation. The boy offered to sell him the bike for \$10, so Deryl invited him around to Holliday's restaurant and went in, ostensibly to get the money. Once inside, he had his dad, W. B. (Chick) Holliday, call the police, who came and found that the bike was indeed Deryl's.

The 12-year-old rider will be given a hearing in juvenile court. J. W. Furr, 16, of near Lakeview, who admitted complicity in the theft, will be tried for larceny in recorders court.

### Essays Will Be Judged On WSTS Saturday Program

Five high school students whose essays on "How the UN May Be Strengthened" were adjudged best in their class, will present them for final judging over WSTS at 11 a. m. Saturday.

Reading their essays on the half-hour program will be Niel Bradley, Dorothy Gale, Howard Scott (Scotty) Burns, Jr., Bryce Garner and Richard Patch.

Their work will be judged on form, content, clarity of expression and method of presentation, with the Rev. F. Craighill Brown, Miss Eleonor Edwards and Mrs. James Boyd serving as judges. The contestant adjudged to have done the best work will be awarded a medal.

The essays were written as a speech class assignment, in which the entire class, taught by Miss Phoebe Witherspoon, took part. This was the local high school's participation in a statewide program among high schools for dissemination of information concerning the United Nations.

Judging will be done at once, and the awarding of the medal to the winner will be part of the program.

### Motor Inspection Lane Will Be Open Monday

A motor inspection lane, the first for this area, will be opened Monday between Jonesboro and Tramway, a mile and a half from the Lee County courthouse at Sanford, to serve motor vehicle owners of Moore, Montgomery, Lee and Chatham counties, according to information from the motor vehicle department at Raleigh.

Motorists are advised to visit the lane as soon as possible, to have their cars checked for deficiencies which may make their operation illegal.

If a car, when checked, fails to pass the tests of brakes, lights and all other parts which mean safety, it is given another chance after repairs are made. Bringing all cars up to par mechanically for the utmost road safety, is an important part of the motor vehicle safety laws passed in the last General Assembly.
