In the handling of the problems of this schizophrenic political year, the leaders showed courage and conviction in their adherence to the straight party line, disposing at the outset of Dixiecrats, Pixiecrats and other splinters off the old block.

Caudle's Address The States Rights "splinter," however, won a tacit recognition as, through speech after speech, reference was never made to Harry S. Truman by name, only to "the President." It took T. Lamar Caudle of Wadesboro and Charlotte, U. S. Assistant Attorney General, to break down the bars Saturday night in a ringing address at the convention banquet, lauding Truman to the skies as a courageous and high principled man, who had done a creditable job in a difficult position. He emphasized the human and democratic qualities of Truman, a personal and much admired friend.

Mr. Caudle was the last of a list of distinguished speakers, which included U. S. Senators Umstead and Hoey, Senator-Nominate J. M. Broughton, Governor-Nominate W. Kerr Scott and Hon. Capus Waynick, chairman of the state Democratic executive committee.

State senators and representatives were thick as flies, speaking on numerous occasions and leading committee and convention meetings.

East-West Line The convention was one of the best attended in history, appearing of unified mind throughout, except at one point in the Saturday afternoon session. This occurred when east and west almost split over a projected resolution to nullify the traditional east-west line in the state.

From time immemorial, state elections have taken note of this imaginary line for alternating choice of candidates for high office, and the state YDC has followed suit. Thrust "cold" upon the meeting without previous passing by the resolutions committee, the resolution brought a spate of speeches for and against.

It was sponsored by the delegations from Mecklenburg, Guilford and Forsyth, weightiest counties of the state, and all in the west. On motion of Rep. George Fbuntain of Tarboro, no action was taken and the resolution was left for meditation, discussion, and possible bringing up at a later meeting—"which I sincerely hope will never happen," Fountain declared.

Blue Makes Speech At the banquet following his election, President Blue was the recipient of high honor, and his acceptance speech went out over two microphones, those of WBIG and WFMY. Asking cooperation in strengthening the Democratic ranks in all parts of the state, in the interest of better government and against subversive influences, he reminded the Young Democrats of their major task—getting out the vote. When Democrats turn out in full numbers, they win, he declared, adding, "The harvest is white in our own

fields. It is within our grasp, and worth every bit of the effort it will take."

Curtain Raiser His speech served as the cueing in of the North Carolina YDC on the presidential election campaign in the state, curtain raiser on five weeks of concentrated work ahead.

H. Clifton Blue, publisher and editor of the Sandhill Citizen at Aberdeen, represented Moore county for the first time in the 1947 General Assembly and was reelected without opposition last May. He has served as president of the Moore County YDC and Eighth District YDC chairman. He is active in community and church affairs as well as matters political. He has served for the past half dozen years as chairman of Moore's successful March of Dimes campaigns. He is active also in the Lions club, in which he has held local and district office.

He served the state YDC organization as secretary during the year just concluded.
