 be stored in this area, by permission of the town.
Fenced-In Area
 The tract was recently fenced in with the strongest of cyclone fencing, at a cost of \$1,000, by the town for storage and protection of its vehicles and mechanical equipment. There is plenty of space for equipment which will be issued to the National Guard battery and it is anticipated that this arrangement will receive approval of the federal authorities until the battery can later take possession of grounds and a building of its own.
 It is expected that a permanent garage, to be used as temporary armory, will be built within a year, and that within two or three years the battery will have its own federally-built standard armory.
