Farmers Elect County and Community Committeemen to Head FPMA Program

Community committeemen who will help administer the program of the Federal Production and Marketing Administration in the coming year were elected by Moore County farmers Thursday, December 15. On Friday, delegates to the county convention, who had been elected Thursday, met in Carthage and elected a county PMA committee.

Joe A. Caddell of Carthage was re-elected chairman of the county committee and A. B. Parker, Carthage Rt. 3, was re-elected vice-chairman. Only one change was made in the committee. Sam Dilling of Jackson was elected a regular member, replacing W. E. Brown of Jackson Springs, Rt. 1.

Others elected were: first alternate, O. F. Currie, Jackson Springs; second alternate, Herbert Bost, Eagle Springs; secretary Walter L. Fields, Carthage; and treasurer, Pauline Maness, Carthage.

Rod Cameron, a star whose name on a marquee guarantees the best in screen adventure, tops the cast of Republic's thrilling new saga of the early west, "Brimstone," coming Sunday and Monday to the Sunrise theatre.

Continuing through today (Friday) and Saturday, December 30-31, with a Saturday matinee at the Carolina theatre, Southern Pines, is the latest, and probably the best, Danny Kaye comedy—in Technicolor, "The Inspector General."

In this production Producer Jerry Wald and his associate producer, Sylvia Fine (Kaye's wife) prove that they knew just what type of vehicle was needed to show Kaye off to the best advantage. For in "The Inspector General" one gets the real Kaye, in most of his phases; the clown, the comedian, the tragedian, the singer of specialized songs and the man who has the exceptional ability of handling each situation in his own inimitable way with incomparable skill and rare understanding. It is a farce comedy in which Kaye offers something no one will want to miss.

Excellent support is furnished by Walter Slazak, Barbara Bates, Gene Lockhart and Elsa Lanchester.

Returning to the Sandhills at the Carolina theatre, Southern Pines, Sunday through Wednesday, with a Tuesday matinee is that lavish production, one of the greatest spectacles ever to reach the screen, "Prince Of Foxes," starring Tyrone Power, Wanda Hendrix and Orson Welles. The production is the first major American movie to be shot in Italy in its entirety since the war.
