At Our Lady of Victory church in West Southern Pines, blessing and distribution of the palms will be held at 10 a. m. Sunday. On Holy Thursday, high mass will be sung by the school children at 9 a. m. Masses on Good Friday and Holy Saturday will be at 7:30 a. m. with the Way of the Cross at 3 p. m. Friday.
