(Continued from Page 1) tical ideas are asked to submit them.

Admiring their spacious new office, toward the furnishing of which a fair beginning has been made, the directors heard with pleasure that some income is being made there for the Chamber. With Mrs. Emily Scheipers, secretary, in charge, business services are being offered, non-competitive with other local businesses, and a good response has already been noted. Public stenography, mimeographing, addressing, etc., are charged for at regular rates. These are being used now mostly by visitors to town but are available to all local businessmen.

Credit Reports Credit inquiries are also coming in and, with the resumption of Merchants Association services under Chamber auspices, Mrs. Scheipers is making the reports as needed. The Merchants Association retired recently as an independent organization and its directors cleared it of all debts before turning it back to its original sponsor, the Chamber of Commerce.

John von Schlegel, appointed to head the new Merchants Association bureau, said he will announce his committee members shortly, and hopes to have representation from all three interested towns, Southern Pines, Pinehurst and Aberdeen. A working organization serving all three is planned.

Whether the AAA, to which

many local hotels, restaurants, service stations and other businesses belong, is playing a fair part by US Highway 1 brought forth considerable discussion. It was felt by several present, on good evidence, that Highways 301 and 15 are getting the lion's share of the association's promotional efforts. With US 1 in better shape than ever before, it was strongly felt that some means should be found to prevent the diversion of tourist travel from it. Some plans for accomplishing this were studied.

Financial Report Details of the moving of the Chamber office, and its cost, were given by President Coleman, along with a complete financial report dating back to the time he took office in October. Expenditures through December 31, totaling \$1,447.41, have included \$517 paid on old bills; \$529 for Christmas lighting, which included labor, and additional wire, sockets and bulbs, all now stored in the basement till next December; rent, secretary's salary, postage, office supplies, and other items. Now scraping the bottom of the money barrel again, the Chamber can do with the more than 50 per cent of dues which remain unpaid, he stated, spurring the directors on to continue their collection campaign.

A bookkeeping system is in process of being set up by Garland McPherson, he said, to go into operation probably this week.

(Continued from Page 1) had its Conservatory of Music admitted without reservation into the National Music association. At Dr. Woodson's request, the annual alumnae homecoming day was postponed from November in order to include it among the inaugural festivities. The alumnae meeting will be held Saturday morning, followed by a luncheon at noon to be attended by inaugural guests and alumnae.

About 75 leading colleges throughout the South will be represented in the academic procession. The inauguration will follow in the college auditorium.

A reception for alumnae and guests will be held in the college parlors at 4:30 p.m., and in the evening conservatory students will be presented in concert in the auditorium.

The 54-year-old president, a native of Monroe City, Mo., was educated in the public schools of Pendleton, Columbia and Manning, S. C. He attended Presbyterian college three years before entering the Navy in World War I. He was graduated from Presbyterian in 1920. He received a B. D. degree from Columbia seminary in 1923, and in 1934 received a doctorate of theology from Union Theological seminary.

He served as pastor of Oakhurst Presbyterian church, Atlanta, 1923-26; pastorate in Thomasville, Ga., 1926-30; First Presbyterian church, Salisbury, 1930-37, and First Presbyterian church, Tampa, Fla., 1937-43.

He was a Naval chaplain two and one-half years of World War I. He twice has served on the board of trustees of both Presbyterian and Davidson colleges.

PARKING LAW

(Continued from Page 1) on Sundays and public holidays. A car cannot be moved simply from one parking spot to another nearby at the expiration of the limit, as this will be counted as continuous parking. A part of the ordinance was the

provision for designated reserved parking spaces for medical doctors. The term "doctor" is defined in the ordinance as anyone legally authorized to sign a death certificate. Doctors falling in this category were considered to be those commonly subject to emergency calls.

Included in the ordinance, and thus made law, was a regulation which went into effect some months ago, prohibiting U-turns at certain downtown intersections (all now marked). Added to these intersections was that at the stoplight at Pennsylvania and Gaines, in West Southern Pines.

A tentative schedule of traffic "priorities" was presented by Commissioner C. S. Patch, Jr., who had developed them from a study of ordinances already set up. For avoidance of accidents and determining who is at fault when an accident occurs, the schedule rates a stoplight as having first priority over any traffic, bringing everything to a halt when it shows red. Second were listed East and West Broad streets and May street (US 1 through town). Third came the east-west "avenues."

Mayor Page referred the schedule to the streets committee, also the matter of marking intersections to indicate through streets.
