

Weldons Facing Life As Farmers In New Home Bought From Fownes Estate

The farmer in the dell has nothing on Bill and Louise (Cosgrove) Weldon. The newlyweds, now owners of the big tenant house of the Fownes estate in Knollwood, are planning to raise one thing and another, including a family.

"Squire" Weldon already has established a nodding acquaintance with the farm livestock, limited at present to a small flock of dumb cluckers in the hen house. And the happy farmers propose to parlay the poultry houses into a substantial broiler trade for the spring hotel season.

In addition, the new owners plan to continue practical farming operations on their acreage at the intersection of the Midland and Carthage roads.

"We have a date to talk it over with the county agent," said Louise this week. "I don't know whether we'll put it back in corn again this year or try another crop. It depends on what soil tests show and on what we can hope to grow successfully."

The Squire explained that down-to-earth farming is imperative—in view of the fact that the purchase of the farm brought with it all sorts of farm machinery, like tractors and plows, and pencil sharpeners and electric mixers.

The farm once was an adjunct of the big estate of the late William C. Fownes, Jr., Pittsburgh industrialist and golfer, former national amateur golf champion and ex-president of the USGA. He died last year at the age of 73.

The tenant house is actually two separate domiciles. The front building, facing towards Midland road, will continue to be tenanted by Mrs. Heizman Mudgett while the Weldons will occupy the main building, facing on the Airport road.


Sandhills Law Firm Has Washington Office
