Defendants are given as Everett V. Walker, Southern Pines city building inspector; Mayor C. N. Page and the town commissioners individually, all of whom, the plaintiff complains, have acted 'arbitrarily, wrongfully and illegally and in derogation of his " rights" in denying the permit for which he has applied.
