(Continued from Page 1) wine, 3,473. Majority against beer—662; against wine, 887. Slightly more than 6,000 persons voted.

The elections board met Thursday morning to certify the vote. The official totals may be slightly different from those given above. These will be given in The Pilot next week, along with the precinct votes.

As last year, the highest dry majorities were rolled up in the upcounty precincts of Ritters, Spencerville, Highfalls, Bensalem, Robbins and Deep River, rated by ABC officers "the worst in the county for all types of liquor law violations."

The control side won four precincts out of 17, as opposed to only three last year. Again favoring continued beer and wine sales were the Southern Pines, Pinehurst and Aberdeen precincts, which among them pay more than half of all the taxes in the county, largely on account of the resort interests concentrated in the Sandhills region.

Whether any of the other towns are planning their own elections yet could not be learned this week. In Carthage, nerve center of the Allied Church League, it would be a bitter campaign, with the result a tossup.

It is considered anybody's guess as to how the municipality of Aberdeen would vote, as a large part of its pro-beer-wine majority was laid to the resort-minded citizens of suburban Southern Pines who happen to be in the Aberdeen precinct.

Pinehurst, though unincorporated, won this privilege through a special act of the 1951 General Assembly, in a double-barreled bill which also knocked out the 60-day limit law for Moore county, on request of the dries.
