Hundreds are expected to visit the showrooms, and take part in the "coming-out parties" of the new Chevrolets at Aberdeen and at Pinehurst.

Daniel Holder Convicted In Accident In Which Betty Holtzclaw Was Injured

Daniel B. Holder, Jr., of Vass, was convicted in Moore recorders court Monday on charges arising from an accident of December 23 in which Miss Betty Holtzclaw of Southern Pines was injured.

Holder was given a three months' sentence, suspended on payment of \$125 and costs, on charges of drunken driving and careless and reckless driving causing an accident and personal injury. He was also ordered by the court to pay \$215 to cover Miss Holtzclaw's medical and hospital expenses, and to pay her father, Oscar Holtzclaw of Jefferson Inn, the costs of repairing his car, provided insurance does not take care of this. Holder's driver's license was also revoked for a year.

The investigating patrolman reported that Holder, driving his truck out of the driveway of a service station on US 1 south of town, had gotten into Miss Holtzclaw's lane of traffic directly in front of her car. Though she tried to avoid him, he struck her car, damaging it to the extent of several hundred dollars and sending the young lady to the hospital.

Holder's truck was also damaged. The patrolman said it contained liquor, though the bottle or bottles were broken by the impact.

This was just one of a number of traffic law violation cases which largely made up the lengthy docket Monday. Judge J. Vance Rowe dealt with most of them severely, especially those in which accidents or drunken driving were involved.

There were three acquittals, one that of Henry Nicholson, Pinehurst Negro, charged with permitting an unlicensed person to drive his car; John D. Kennedy, Pinehurst, acquitted of careless and reckless driving and drunken driving causing an accident; and Robert C. Frye, Carthage, acquitted of driving on wrong side of highway causing accident.
