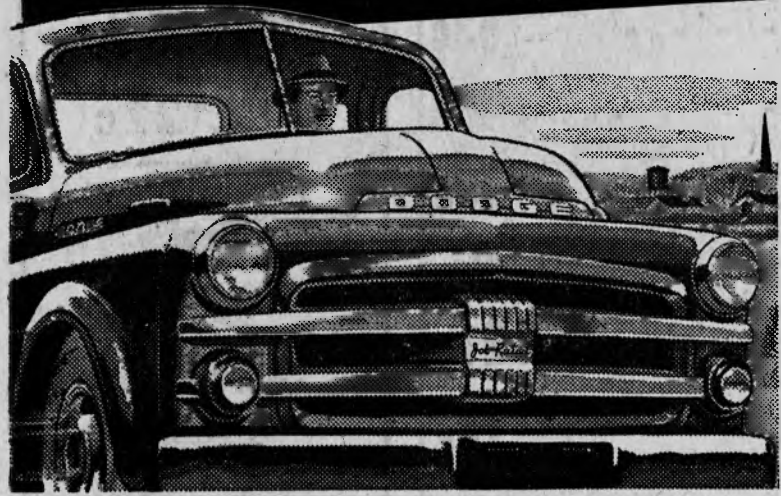

Wyandotte Reports Good Year But No Immediate Plans For Building

The annual report of the Wyandotte Worsted company, operating mills in Pittsfield and Waterville, Maine, Rochester, N. H., and Centerville, Conn., took note of the company's 1950 purchase of land at Lakeview, near Southern Pines, but said "expansion will depend on future developments."

Net earnings of \$1,047,029 for 1951 were reported, compared with \$963,118 in 1950, despite wool price fluctuations and a "marked" increase in taxes.

A rise in net sales to \$31,230,329 in its fiscal year ended November 30, was listed, compared with \$18,526,932 in the year before.

But President Nat E. Barrows reported that although dollar sales were higher, yardage produced was about the same as in 1950—the difference arising from higher costs of raw material and labor.

Continuing through tonight (Friday) and Saturday, March 21-22, at 8:15, with a Saturday matinee at 3 at the Carolina theatre, Southern Pines, is the Pulitzer Prize-winning story "Death Of A Salesman," which as a play held Broadway theatregoers in a vice-like grip for almost two years, and which continues undiminished in Stanley Kramers film version.

With Frederic March starred as Willy Loman in one of the great film performances of the year, "Salesman" is now even more intense in its emotional impact, and will be a memorable experience for all adult patrons which can truly be put in the "must see" class.

Still running in New York as a roadside attraction, that superb production "The River," will play at the Carolina Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, March 23-24-25, at 8:15 p. m. with matinees Sunday and Tuesday at 3. Magnificent pictorially, and interesting and informative throughout, "The River," directed by Jean Renoir, is the first film to be made entirely in India in Technicolor and is the first screen appearance for several of the leading characters who appear in the story.

It combines the everyday life of an English family with the "real" India and its teeming millions. Colorfully presented is their Diwali Festival, when millions of lights burn all over India; the Kali Juja Ceremony and the "Holi Day" Festival, when Hindus

celebrate the arrival of Spring by throwing colored powders on each other. "The River" will prove a rare treat to those who want something different in screen fare.

Starting Thursday, March 27, with a matinee at 3 and a night show at 8:15, is the screen version of "A Streetcar Named Desire" a Pulitzer Prize winner as well as a New York critics Award winner. The film stars Vivien Leigh, who was given the Academy Award for her portrayal of "Blanche," with Marlon Brando who was in the original stage cast.
