"Plymouth Adventure," the story of the Mayflower's perilous voyage to America, is continuing at the Carolina theatre Thursday, Friday and Saturday, December 18-19-20, at 8:15 p. m. with a Saturday matinee at 3. A superb cast has been assembled for this lavish sea spectacle, including Spencer Tracy as Captain Jones; Gene Tierney as Dorothy Bradford; Leo Genn as Governor Bradford; Van Johnson as John Alden, and Dawn Addams as Priscille Mullins. This is Dore Scharly's personal production, possibly the best film ever made about the founding fathers of America, and certainly one of the finer pictures of the year.

The characterizations are of genuine people reacting in a thoroughly human way to a highly dramatic situation. Director Brown has achieved perfect balance of the exciting, realistic adventure episodes and interwoven moments of romance. All are photographed in glorious Technicolor.

Another one of those delightful British comedies that abound in sophisticated irony and clever characterization is offered in "The Promoter," coming to the Carolina Sunday through Wednesday, December 14-17, at 8:15 p. m. with matinees Sunday and Tuesday at 3. Starring Alec Guinness, who is fast rising to popularity in America, it is a droll tale of the blithe daring by which a solicitor's clerk rises up the ladder of social and business success.

Glynis Johns and Valerie Hobson turn in charming performances as the two main women in Guinness' life. This is a wonderful role for Guinness and he plays it magnificently adding yet another new portrait to his swiftly growing collection.

Starting Thursday night, December 18 at 8:15 is the Technicolor production "The Savage" starring Charlton Heston (of "Greatest Show on Earth"), Susan Morrow and Ian MacDonald.
