**First Aid Class To Be Conducted By Lyle McDonald**

A first-aid class for residents of Southern Pines is soon to be conducted by Lyle McDonald, sponsored by the Moore County Red Cross chapter. Plans have been proposed for eventually organizing a Moore County Rescue Squad, comprised of trainees from the first-aid class.

McDonald, son of L. D. McDonald of Southern Pines, has been a qualified Red Cross instructor since his return from Charlotte last year. The class under his direction will be the first such class to be held in Southern Pines. One was held in Robbins, four months ago.

Classes will be set for whatever nights the group taking the course may prefer. Members of the Southern Pines Fire Department, all of whom endorse the first-aid course, will be among those taking it. 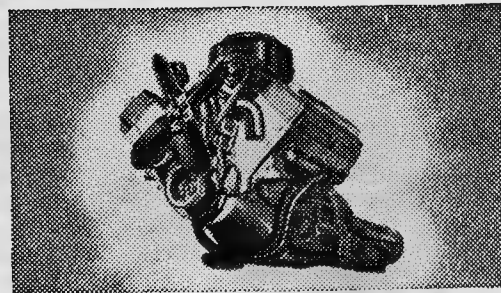
