

Edwin Gill Tells Rotarians World Must Think More

Neighborliness May Be Lost In Speed Of Modern Living

The fast-moving modern world needs time in which to think, State Treasurer Edwin Gill told members of the Southern Pines Rotary Club and guests assembled at the Country Club for their regular luncheon meeting Friday.

Mr. Gill, one of the ablest speakers in the State, was introduced by June Phillips. The Rev. C. V. Covell, president, presided.

"In an age characterized by smooth efficiency, push-button power and almost instantaneous communication, the world needs, as never before, time to think," Mr. Gill said. "Perhaps the most characteristic single attribute of our day and time is speed. Therefore, the most important question of our day is: 'Where are we going?'"

Modern man may forget the great social value of neighborliness, the speaker warned. Our grandparents, he said, not only needed their neighbors but enjoyed their society. Corn husking, barn-raising and women's quilting parties were "a wonderful social experience."

Must Teach To Think

Pointing out that our grandparents were intense individualists and exceedingly self-reliant, yet quick to come to the rescue of their neighbors in time of adversity, Mr. Gill said that now "we desperately need the sort of education that teaches the child to think for himself and to reach creditable decisions concerning the great issues that confront us."

Modern scorn for the old virtues such as thrift and honesty "causes us sometimes to yearn for the old copy-book days when the hands of children were taught to fashion words and at the same time learn a moral," he said.

During the course of his talk, Mr. Gill also noted that while North Carolina wants industry, he does not think industry should supplant agriculture as the chief source of employment in the state. The people of North Carolina should not lose their roots in the soil, he said.
