#### MISSING GIRL RETURNS HOME

Mrs. Lou Dorothy McCrimmon Fox, 18-year-old Negro girl who disappeared two months ago, and who has been the object of an intensive search by the sheriff's department and the SBI, returned Saturday afternoon to her home near Vass.

Sheriff C. J. McDonald said that, after learning from the girl's family that she had returned home, he went there to talk with her but found her "too upset" to be immediately interviewed.

He said he talked with her a short while but she was unable to give a connected story at that time, and until he had the full story he would rather not give details of what little she had said.

The girl was last seen Saturlay night, September 11, talking with some soldiers at a Negro amusement park near Lakeview, to which she had gone accompanied by her

There were several mysterious angles to her disappearance and there was some suspicion of foul play.
