### Bids Asked For Two Moore County Highway Projects

Two Moore County projects are among those on which the State Highway Commission requested bids Tuesday.

Bids will be received Tuesday, December 21, and will be reviewed Thursday, December 23.

Bids on both the Moore projects had been rejected in whole or in part at a recent session of the commission and the projects were opened for new bids, with specifications changed in the case of a culvert project, this week.

Moving buildings off the right of way on the proposed new US 501 and 15 route that will by-pass Carthage, from Pinehurst, is one of the projects. The route runs 10.42 miles from a point on NC 2 (Midland Road) about three-quarters of a mile east of the intersection of NC 2 and US 501 and 15, to a point on US 501 and 15 about one and a half miles east of Carthage.

The other Moore project on which bids were asked is a triple-reinforced concrete box culvert on the county road running from a point on NC 22 north of Highfalls, east along or near the Bible School Road toward Glendon.

The commission decided that a box culvert would be cheaper than the arch culvert formerly specified for the project which in all includes 3.9 miles of grading, paving and structures.

as to the outcome. Bobby Cline, High School student, was introduced by Carl Holt as junior guest for the day.

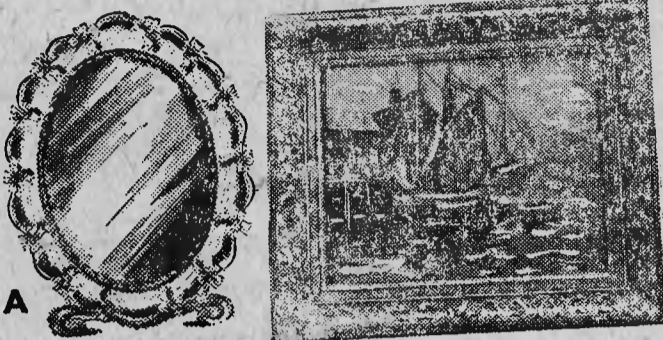

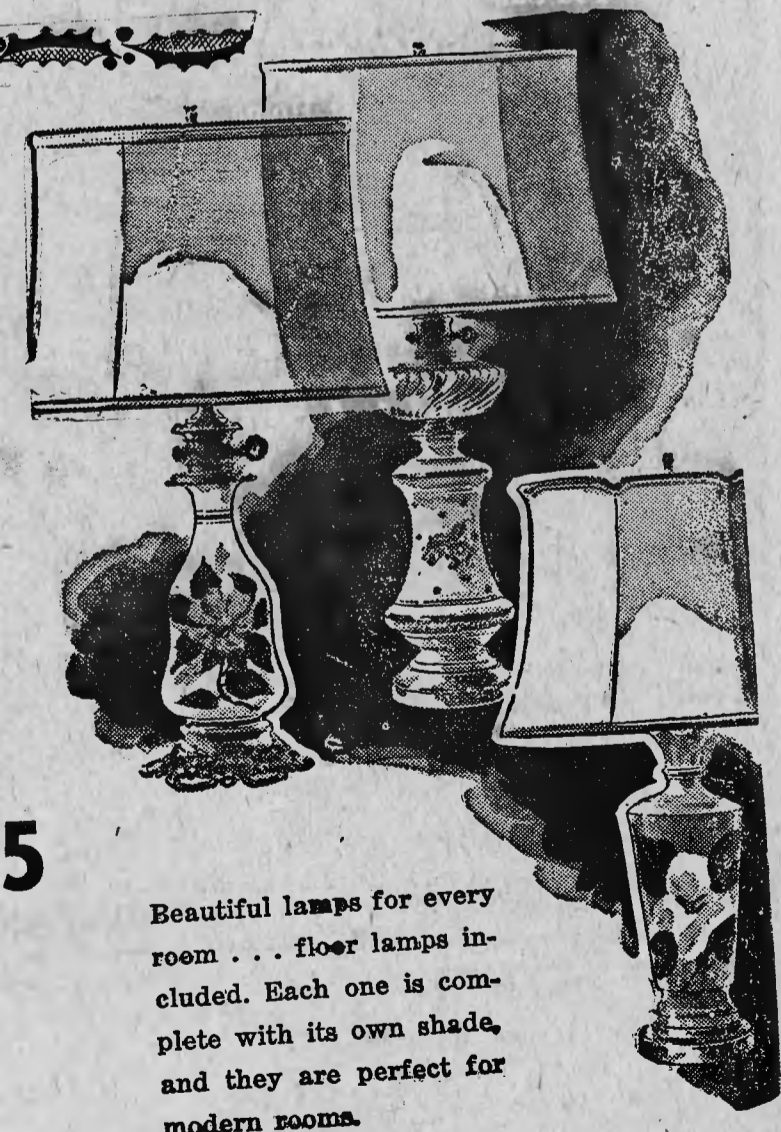
