Henry L. Scott will be the ninth entertainer in this season's series of artists and guest speakers presented by the Pinehurst Forum when he appears next Thursday, March 31, at 8:45 p.m. at the Pinehurst Country Club, in an evening's program entitled, "Concerto For Fun." The Forum meeting will be preceded by the Country Club's weekly buffet supper at 7 o'clock, for which advance reservations are required.

Mr. Scott, distinguished pianist and originator of "concert humor" is presenting something unique on the American concert scene. His career represents a long and impressive array of theatre appearances, short pictures for Paramount, radio engagements, a season at New York's famous Rainbow Room and finally a debut at Town Hall as "America's First Concert Humorist." The past three years have marked his steady development into a national attraction in concert halls from coast to coast.

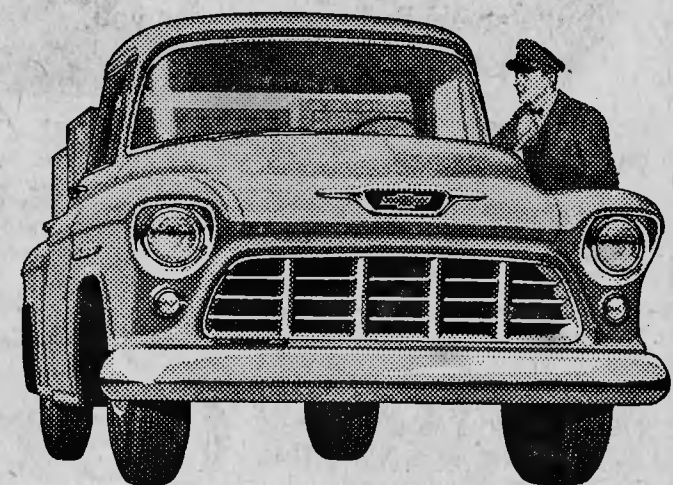
