ACCIDENT WEATHER

Weatherwise it was clear when 708 fatal auto crashes occurred in the state last year. The Motor Vehicles Department's summary of fatal smashups shows it was cloudy when 91 of the tragedies occurred, raining when 54 occurred, and foggy when 15 other death-dealing accidents occurred. Weather conditions were not indicated in 12 reports. For the year there were 880 fatal smash-Aberdeen ups which added to the state's traffic death toll of 991.




