Coleman Speaks To Rotary Club; Howard Inducted

Mr. Coleman now spends a large part of his time on lecture tours over the nation.

As an American agent in Turkey, Mr. Coleman directed the spying activities of some 75 persons, many of whom, he said, were a high type of professional person who opposed Hitler and the Nazis and refused to take financial compensation for their efforts.

How OSS evaluated information and misinformation was de-

scribed by the speaker, with some specific illustrations that showed the complexities of the task.
