## School Children

Moore County school teachers and principals this week were advised that the Morehead Planetarium on the University of North Carolina campus at Chapel Hill has arranged a series of eight programs especially designed for presentation to school children of all ages during the ensuing scholastic year.

The programs were arranged in cooperation with the N. C. Department of Public Instruction, and will be presented every Wednesday and Thursday at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Advance reservations will be necessary in order to insure accommodation of groups coming to Chapel Hill expressly to see the Planetarium. More than 30,000 children attended the special school programs in 1954-55.

The special demonstrations for school children are presented in addition to the regular schedule of public shows each night at 8:30 o'clock and Saturday and Sunday matinees. Additional shows for large groups of school, church, social, civic or industrial organizations may be arranged by contacting the Planetarium by mail or telephone.
