

Continuing Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 8:15 p. m. with a Saturday matinee at 3 p. m. at the Carolina Theatre is the technicolor production, "Santiago" with Alan Ladd, Rossanna Podesta and Lloyd Nolan.

"The Vagabond King," the most colorful and rousing adventure story ever set to music is coming to the Carolina Sunday through Wednesday, August 26-29, with three shows Sunday at 3, 7 and 9 p. m., week nights at 8:15 and a Wednesday matinee at 3.

The new Paramount production, starring Kathryn Grayson, Oreste, the young European tenor in his motion picture debut, Rita Moreno, Sir Cedric Hardwicke and Walter Hampton, is a glittering film of tremendous spectacle and sweep, told to the ever-fresh ever-delightful Rudolph Friml music.

Performances, both musical and dramatic, vie for praises for magnificent settings and exciting action in this VistaVision, Technicolor version of a turbulent chapter in French history. The plot, of course, deals with Francois Villon, the swordsman-poet whose ragamuffin army recruited from the streets of Paris battled the might of the invading Burgundians in the 15th century.

In the title role Oreste proves he has one of the great voices of our time as well as a handsome, dashing presence.

Well-matched with the lovely Katherine Grayson, whose renditions of the Friml music are in themselves worth the price of admission, the Maltese-born tenor sings the famed "Song of the Vagabonds" and "Only A Rose" with virility and glorious soaring tones, handles the sword like a fencing master, and romances

with the aplomb of a Don Juan. In addition to the original songs, Friml himself has written several new ones that blend cleverly with the plot, and there are lively dances galore.

All in all, "The Vagabond King" is a wonderful treat for both eyes and ears.

SUNRISE

Mysterious, alluring and frequently deadly, the jungle world of Africa supplies the breathless locale for Columbia Pictures' "Safari," starring Victor Mature and Janet Leigh at the Sunrise Theatre on Sunday and Monday.

Actually filmed in Kenya's fabulous North Frontier District, heartland of the dread Mau Mau who provide some of the new film's many breathless action moments, "Safari" is said to combine the splendor and primitive pageantry of "King Solomon's Mines" with the mighty thrills and love-adventure of "Mogambo."

"Safari" was filmed in color by Technicolor and in CinemaScope. Mature plays a white hunter in the film; Miss Leigh, a former chorus girl who is affianced to an elderly, wealthy Englishman with an obsession—he is determined to kill a black-maned lion, rarest and greatest of the man-eating jungle kings. The safari, under Mature's guidance, pushes deeper and deeper into the dangerous Mau Mau country, facing incredible tensions created not only by the perils surrounding them but by their own personal entanglements and conflicts.

The hunter and the girl are inevitably attracted to each other. The elderly fiance, aware of their mutual, growing interest, not only attempts to kill his rival but disobeys orders in a desperate, solitary effort to kill the lion. Incessant Mau Mau attacks reportedly provide "Safari" with a truly memorable climax.
