**Blue Knights Top Rock Ridge 36-13 To Win Division Four Championship**

**Pinehurst Maid Is Given Suspended Term For Forgery**

Annie May Gooch Washington of Pinehurst, 22-year-old Negro mother of three, drew a prison term of three to five years in Moore criminal court Monday, for 11 counts of forgery, involving checks passed on merchants in Southern Pines, Pinehurst, Carthage and Aberdeen.

Judge Walter E. Crissman then suspended the sentence on good behavior conditions and on condition she repay the full amounts of the checks—a total of \$245.

Posing as a maid in a Pinehurst home, the well-dressed, well-spoken young woman driving her own car posed as a maid in a Pinehurst home, claiming the checks were her salary. Visiting the stores on Thursday afternoons—"maid's day off"—she would buy a small amount of merchandise in each case, and take the rest in change.

Nobody ever asked her for any identification, she told police. Defense counsel informed the court. "They made it so easy for her, after the first ones she just kept right on."

Though her attorney claimed there were a "couple of the checks" she wouldn't admit to, he pleaded her guilty on all counts. Chief C. E. Newton of Southern Pines testified she told him she wrote them all.

The victimized merchants were also represented in court though, because of her guilty plea, they did not have to testify. They were Perkins' Jewelers, McAllister and Hobbs food store, Lee's Stores Inc., McNeill & Co., Patch's Department Store, Colonial Stores, in Southern Pines; Mack's Five and Ten, Bon Mart, Melvin Brothers and Craig Drug Co., Aberdeen, and Lee's Stores Inc., Carthage. She was apprehended when she attempted to cash a check at the Glitter Box in Aberdeen.

The woman was employed during this time as a nurse aid at St. Joseph of the Pines Hospital.

Sonny Baker, much talked about quarterback for the Boone Trail six-man football team, lived up to his press clippings Friday night as he tried desperately to spark his team to a victory over the Southern Pines Blue Knights. But the story at the final gun was the same: the Knights, playing one of the best games of the season, came out on top of a 36-13 score and moved one more rung upwards on their climb for a third straight state championship in the six-man leagues.

In defeating Boone Trail, the Knights earned the right to play Rock Ridge High School for the eastern division championship in six-man competition. If they should win that one, scheduled for Friday night in Buie's Creek, they would face the winner of the Aberdeen-Oak Hill game (western division) for the state title.

In the game Friday night, which was played on the Pinehurst field before a large crowd and in good weather, Kenneth Creech and Lynn van Benschoten proved again that they are the big guns in the Knights' offensive punch. Creech scored twice, once on a two-yard line buck in the third quarter, and again on a 15-yard dash in the fourth quarter.

Van Benschoten scored in the first quarter on a two yard buck and in the fourth quarter on a 10-yard plunge over the center.

Tony Parker took a pass from Bobby Watkins in the second period and raced 30 yards for the other tally. Charles Watkins, getting better all the time, kicked three extra points.

Leonard said his charges looked exceptionally sharp on defense and could single out no single player as outstanding. "This game was strictly team play with six men on the field all the time doing their jobs the best they knew how," he said. "If we play this well again, we don't guarantee a win, but at least someone will know they've had a real game."

Boone Trail scored both its touchdowns on pass plays. Baker, touted as all-state and looking the part all the time, scored on a 15-yard pass and Jim Brown scored

on a 30-yard one. The win marked 32 straight for the Blue Knights and gave them the championship of Division four in the state set-up.
