Mr. and Mrs. George Carney and son, Ross, will return home for Christmas after a week's motor trip through Florida.

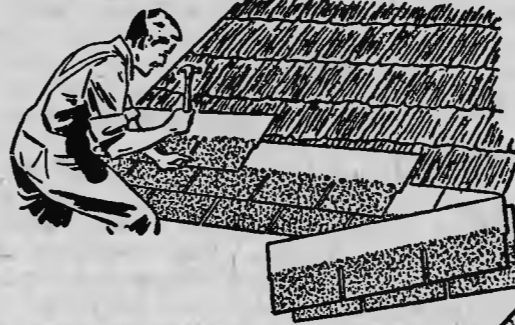
Col. J. W. Faulconer left the Berkshire Hotel Sunday for three months in Palm Beach, Fla.
