Thomas Surratt, assistant administrator of Moore Memorial Hospital, has resigned and will join the staff of Rowan Memorial Hospital in Salisbury as manager of the business office and comptroller, it has been announced by Thomas Howerton, administrator.

Surratt, a native of Salisbury, will leave his duties here May 10, and go to Salisbury soon thereafter. He accepted the new position, he said this week, because it represented promotion and a big step forward in his career as a hospital official.

The Rowan Hospital has 257 beds and is considered one of the outstanding institutions in the state.
