Construction of a new club-house at Pine Needles Country Club will get underway next week, Warren Bell, manager, told The Pilot at noon today. Cost of the structure, which will

be made of brick and wood in the same general design as four lodges constructed there last summer, was not disclosed.

The new clubhouse will be loated between the lodges and what is now number two tee. Bell said a two acre lake and a new putting green and practice tee would also be built at the same time, to be located in front of the clubhouse:

With an area of approximately 11,000 square feet, the building will house men's and women's locker rooms, golf shop, dining room and kitchen, three offices, storage facilities, and will have our luxury rooms for guests.


