Complete plans have been worked out between a group of the General's friends and Pinehurst, Incorporated, as owner of the property. All future recorded and printed maps of the village will show the new name and a marker will be erected at the Park entrance which faces the Carolina vista. The inscription will read as follows:

"This Park is named in Marshall, General of the Army, Chief of Staff 1939 1945, Secretary of State 1947-1949, President of the Red Cross 1949-1950, Secretary of Defense 1951, Citizen
